Our guest speaker for the evening is local photographer, Marilyn Cook. Marilyn has enjoyed a long career as an educator, primarily at Eastern Florida State College and has been a guest of the CCB several times.

In January, Marilyn presented an assignment to the CCB members to create images using ICM (Intentional Camera Movement), a technique where the photographer uses a low ISO setting and slow shutter speed with camera movement to create streaks, circles and other motion related images.

CCB 2024 - More Planning

The Camera Club of Brevard is excited to announce the guest speaker at our 6:30 pm March 5th, 2024 meeting will be Steven Sasson, the inventor of the first hand held digital camera. The title of Steven's presentation is *"Disruptive Innovation: The story of the first digital camera"*.

Steven will review the creation of the first digital camera prototype he developed in 1975 at the Eastman Kodak Company as well as how the concept was demonstrated within Kodak during the following year. Subsequent technical innovations with megapixel imagers, image compression products in the mid 1980's, and the early commercialization of professional and consumer digital still cameras in the early 1990's will also be discussed.

The internal Kodak reaction to these developments will be highlighted as well as some of Steven's learned observations about how to deal with disruptive innovation within an established corporate environment.

Changes coming in our monthly competitions!

The Board of Directors had a lengthy discussion about ways to improve our monthly competitions. It seems many members are reluctant to participate because they feel they will never win, or they feel there is too much competition in their designated class. Some feel the contest themes are too difficult. With this in mind, we have restructured the monthly competitions as follows:

1. We are eliminating Class A and Class B.

2. We are creating 3 levels of competition: Novice, Intermediate and Advanced.

3. We are eliminating awards for first, second and third place.

4. We are creating *"Awards of Merit"* in each category at the discretion of our monthly judges. For example, there may be 5 or more awards of merit in one class, and maybe only 1 or 2 in another. Since we do not employ a point system for judging, the process becomes completely subjective.

We will try this competition format for a few months. In our view, this new method should encourage more participation from new members and novices, and create more equitable opportunities in each level. Simply increasing the levels from 2 to 3 opens up possibilities for everyone in the club. It will also allow judges a little more leeway in awarding photos the recognition they deserve. This is how a competition should be presented and organized; a fair shot at a merit award for all levels of photographic skill. This trial will commence with the March competition with the theme of "Abandoned".

Let's make this work! Good luck!



Have you mentored a new CCB member lately?

New photographers are often bewildered by all the technical buzzwords and other jargon in the photography field. Such baffling terms as "stops of light" (or exposure), "depth of field", "image noise", and similar terms just serve to confuse many folks, and let's face it, deflect or deter otherwise interested individuals from joining in the fun. They may LOVE the images, but are completely turned off by what appears to be the overwhelming challenges of learning the trade. Ironically, in the new digital age, and even more in the mirrorless age, photography that should be easier can often be even more challenging than the old film days..

Anyone besides me remember the "sunny – 16" rule? How about "flash film, daylight film, or indoor film"? How about "point and shoot"? All of these terms and anecdotes from the past have the same things in common . . . The photographer simply wants to capture the scene in front of his eyes in a way that can be easily remembered and shared with others. One of the very best analogies for helping folks understand the many challenges is the "Exposure Triangle". This relatively simple term and concept can go a long way to help get folks "on their way" to becoming an accomplished photographer. This "Exposure Triangle" concept, however is just the beginning.

Understanding the how's and why's of capturing light (and therefore an image) is fundamental, but the real progress takes place when our intrepid new photographers apply their new found understanding, but get frustrated with their results. Their images(though in general adequately exposed) just doesn't convey what they think their eyes were seeing at the time. This is where we at CCB come in. Everyone needs to chime in and help our budding new photographers get past the basic challenges of exposure, and help them turn their snapshots into true photographs.

Such concepts as composition, balanced subjects, leading lines, color temperature, golden hour, optimal cropping, and more will help get these folks on their way!

A couple of great resources on the web for basic exposure are <u>Capture The Atlas.com</u> and <u>Photography Llife.com</u>, both great resources for basic Exposure Triangle understanding.

TIPS to becoming a better photographer!

iPhone Photography Tutorial for Beginners

Welcome to this beginner's guide on using your iPhone's camera! Whether you're new to photography or just new to the iPhone, this guide will help you capture stunning photos with ease. Experiment and have fun!

Getting Started with the Camera

- 1. Accessing the Camera App
- Quickly access the Camera from the lock screen by swiping left.
- Alternatively, find the Camera icon on your home screen or Control Center.
- 2. Familiarize Yourself with the Interface
- Explore the shutter button, mode selection (Photo, Video, Portrait, etc.), and the flip camera option.
- Tap the top-right corner icons for flash and Live Photos settings.

Composition and Framing

1. Understanding Composition

• Good composition is key to great photography. Use the 'Rule of Thirds' by imagining a grid (you can turn this on in Settings > Camera > Grid) and placing key elements of your photo along these lines or intersections.

2. Practice Framing Your Shots

• Try different angles and perspectives. Get down low or shoot from above to add interest to your photos.

Using Different Modes

1. Exploring Camera Modes

• Practice switching between different modes like Photo, Video, Portrait, and Pano (panorama). Each mode is designed for specific types of shots.

2. When to Use Each Mode

• Use Portrait mode for pictures of people or pets, Pano for wide landscapes, and standard Photo mode for most other shots.

TIPS to becoming a better photographer!

iPhone Photography Tutorial for Beginners

Focus and Exposure

- 1. Adjusting Focus and Exposure
- Tap on the screen where you want to focus.
- Swipe up or down to adjust the exposure (brightness) of your shot.
- 2. Locking Focus and Exposure

• Press and hold on the screen where you want to focus until you see 'AE/AF Lock'. This is particularly useful for shots with a lot of movement.



Editing and Enhancing Photos

- 1. Basic Editing in Photos App
- Open your photo and tap 'Edit' in the top-right corner.
- Experiment with cropping, filters, and adjusting light and color.
- 2. Try Advanced Editing
- For more advanced options, explore third-party apps like Adobe Lightroom or VSCO.

Photography is a journey of continuous learning and creativity. Play around with your iPhone's camera, try new things, and don't be afraid to experiment. With practice, you'll be capturing beautiful moments in no time. Happy shooting!
